Level I  Mixed levels- Introductory course for all students beginning a new course of study in a foreign language, including students who wish to take and additional foreign language	PMHS	Spanish, French, Italian and Mandarin	<ul> <li>Learn proper, native pronunciation</li> <li>Develop a basic ability to communicate both orally and in writing</li> <li>Read and analyze basic texts in the target language</li> <li>Learn the usage of basic grammatical structures which include simple vocabulary and verb conjugations to communicate in authentic situations.</li> <li>Mandarin students are introduced to the sounds, characters and basic grammatical structures of modern Mandarin.</li> </ul>

Level II  Mixed grades, primarily 9th graders	PMHS	Spanish, French, Italian & Mandarin	<ul> <li>Write descriptive and summary paragraphs with clear topic sentences and supporting detail</li> <li>Make oral presentations which require group work and preparation.</li> <li>Improve on advanced vocabulary through five thematic units</li> <li>Read and analyze at an intermediate level</li> <li>Express personal opinions and perspectives</li> </ul>
Level II  Mixed grades, primarily 9th graders	PMHS	Latin	<ul> <li>Read adapted Latin literature, focusing on the Roman conquest of Britain</li> <li>Analyze and discuss grammar, syntax, vocabulary, and derivatives</li> </ul>
Level III  Mixed grades, primarily 10th graders	PMHS	Spanish, French, Italian & Mandarin	<ul> <li>Demonstrate their understanding of the main ideas and significant details of materials presented orally and in writing in the target language</li> <li>Initiate and sustain face-to-face conversations in the target language based on realistic experiences</li> <li>Able to use past, present and future tenses to communicate about their own experiences and contrast them to the experiences of people from different cultures</li> <li>This course culminates in a Regents equivalency exam</li> </ul>
Level III  Mixed grades, primarily 10th graders	PMHS	Latin	<ul> <li>Read adapted Latin literature, focusing on the early Roman Empire</li> <li>Analyze and discuss grammar, syntax, vocabulary, and derivatives</li> <li>The Latin III course will culminate in a state exam, CAWNY Checkpoint B</li> </ul>
Level IV/V  Mixed grades, Level IV mostly 11th and Level V mostly 12th graders  These two levels are combined in one class and the curriculum alternates	PMHS	French, Italian & Mandarin (level IV only for Mandarin)	<ul> <li>Students will expand upon and refine their knowledge of grammar and vocabulary acquired in levels I, II, III.</li> <li>Equipped with this knowledge, students interact with authentic materials such as videos, literature, film, documentaries, dialogues, current events, and interviews with native speakers.</li> <li>Students produce spontaneous speech in the target language to express their thoughts, feelings, values and cultural understanding.</li> <li>Students conduct research and prepare presentations on a variety of cultural topics.</li> </ul>

Level IV/IV Honors  Mixed grades, mostly 11th graders	PMHS	Spanish	<ul> <li>Students can recognize traditions of another culture that influence behavior and draw comparisons to their own culture</li> <li>Use culturally appropriate learned vocabulary and structures associated with a broad range of topics and structures such as complex sentences/paragraphs to communicate through the full range of time frames</li> <li>Through the use of current events and authentic materials, students broaden their oral skills by presenting their understanding of the events</li> </ul>
Level IV/V  Mixed grades, Level IV mostly 11th and Level V mostly 12th graders	PMHS	Latin	<ul> <li>Curriculum A</li> <li>Read unadapted Latin literature, focusing on the Epic poetry of Vergil's Aeneid.</li> <li>Analyze and discuss the author's use of literary devices, mood, diction, and syntax</li> <li>Curriculum B</li> <li>Read unadapted Latin literature, focusing on the Lyric poetry of Horace and Catullus</li> <li>Analyze and discuss the author's use of literary devices, mood, diction, and syntax</li> </ul>
AP Spanish / SUPA  AP Spanish- mixed grades, SUPA 12th graders only	PMHS	Spanish, French, Italian	<ul> <li>Communicate solely in the target language as the entire class is conducted in the target language</li> <li>Ability to express opinions and persuade providing support through information obtained from authentic sources</li> <li>Read and analyze literature in the target language</li> <li>Understand the cultural implications of the spoken language and of the dynamics of social interactions</li> <li>Write independently about a broad range of topics that extend beyond the students' daily lives to include issues, ideas, and opinions that are of general interest to the target cultures</li> </ul>
